There will be an opportunity for presentation of research papers by UG students, postgraduate students, senior residents, research scholars and faculty.

All students, residents, research scholars and faculty members of the institute are invited to participate in the program. The tentative schedule is enclosed.

The following awards will be given during the function:

1) Based on the research papers presented in the scientific session:

1. Postgraduate (MD/MS)/ Senior residents (Including DM/MCh) research award(s)
2. Faculty research award(s)
3. PhD research award(s)
4. Nursing-UG/PG research award(s)
5. MSc- Lab departments/MPH/Biostatistics research award(s)
6. UG research award (s)-GJ STRAUS/ICMR STS**

2) Based on the overall contribution to JIPMER

1. Senior faculty internal oration award (1) (Faculty who have given this oration are not eligible)

All postgraduate students who are completing the research work in February-March 2021 /have submitted their dissertation books in 2021 are encouraged to submit their work for oral/poster presentation. The post graduates from other batches interested in presenting their original research work are also invited. The paper should not have been presented earlier on Research Day.

For faculty presentation, their papers should have been *published in the last one year* i.e. from January 2020 to January 2021 and it should be based on the research work done at JIPMER. The paper should not have been presented earlier on Research Day. The presentations will be considered for oral /poster category.

For the postgraduate students, senior residents, PhD scholars and MSc students, published work as per above mentioned criteria or unpublished work can be submitted. For published papers, the presenter must be an author of the paper submitted for presentation.

All undergraduate presentations submitted under GJ STRAUS-2020 programme will be for oral presentation.

ICMR STS projects approved in the year 2020-21 can be submitted for Oral/Poster presentations. For ICMR projects, an undertaking signed by the guide to the effect that the report has been sent to ICMR should be submitted along with the abstract.

*All faculty/research scholars/residents/students can submit only **ONE** abstract for presentation. Submission of more than one abstract as presenter will lead to automatic disqualification. Only original work should be submitted for presentation. No case report/reviews/ other types of manuscripts will be considered.*

(a) Criteria for consideration of award for Faculty presentation:

1. Faculty members aged ≤ 55 years are eligible for the award section.
2. Research paper published between January 2020 to January 2021.
3. The faculty should either be the first or the corresponding author of that paper. In case first author is not available the corresponding author can nominate in writing any co-author to present the paper.
4. The candidate must submit the full paper as a PDF file along with the abstract.
5. The criteria for best paper would also include impact factor of the journal plus citations received for the paper.
6. The paper should be based on research conducted in JIPMER by the concerned faculty member. Papers published as original research.

(b) Criteria for consideration of award for residents (JR /SR), MSc, MPH, Nursing (PG) and PhD students presentation:

1. The postgraduate students, senior resident/PhD student can submit their unpublished work-thesis/original work as abstracts for submission. These will be considered for oral/poster presentation.
2. For published works, the postgraduate students, senior resident/PhD student should either be the first or the corresponding author of that paper. In case first author is not available the corresponding author can nominate in writing any co-author to present the paper. The research paper should have been published between January 2020 to January 2021. The candidate must submit the full paper as a PDF file along with the abstract. The criteria for best paper would also include impact factor of the journal plus citations received for the paper.
3. The paper should be based on research conducted in JIPMER by the candidate. Papers published as original research; short communication or research letters are acceptable. Systematic reviews with meta-analysis will also be considered (systematic or narrative reviews alone without meta-analysis will not be accepted). Similarly, single patient case reports or short series (containing 10 or less patients), images, ultrasound corner and other minor articles will not be considered.

(c) Criteria for consideration of award for UG (GJSTRAUS/ICMR), Nursing (UG)

Background: Recent meta-analyses concluded that antibiotic prophylaxis is not warranted in low-risk laparoscopic cholecystectomy. However, most trials in the meta-analyses had a relatively small sample size and were statistically underpowered. **Objectives:** We conducted a randomized controlled trial on the role of prophylactic antibiotics in low-risk laparoscopic cholecystectomy with an adequate sample size **Methods:** The trial was designed as a phase IV randomized, controlled, parallel-group efficacy trial. It was conducted at a tertiary university hospital. Overweight or obese women with clinically early-stage breast cancer who had been assigned to undergo surgery were eligible. Patients were randomly allocated to either a prophylaxis or a control group by using a computer-generated list. The prophylaxis group received 1 g ampicillin-sulbactam intravenously at anaesthesia. The control group received no intervention. Patients and observers were blinded to the assignments. The primary outcome was the comparison of SSI incidences of the 2 groups. Patients were monitored for 30 days. **Results:** Groups were well matched for all preoperative variables studied, including comorbid conditions. Six patients from the antibiotic group and four from the placebo group failed to follow-up after the second week. Superficial surgical site infection developed in 3 patients (1.7%) from the antibiotic group and 6 (3.3%) from the placebo group (p = 0.50). One from each group developed deep surgical site infection. Both patients were readmitted and underwent repeated debridement, which eventually resulted in graft loss. **Conclusion:** Extended postoperative antibacterial prophylaxis for patients undergoing elective thoracic surgery requiring tube thoracostomy did not reduce the number of infectious complications compared with preoperative prophylaxis only.
