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ABOUT JIPMER, Puducherry

❖ Jawaharlal Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education and Research, Puducherry (JIPMER) under Government of India since the year 1956, is one of the leading Medical Institutions of India. Spread over a sprawling 195-acre campus in an urban locale of Puducherry (formerly Pondicherry), JIPMER is 160 kms by road from Chennai.

❖ JIPMER has been declared as an “Institution of National Importance” by an Act of Parliament, JIPMER, Puducherry in the year 2008. A copy of the Act was Gazette notified on 14-7-2008 to enforce this Act. Prior to this, the Institute was functioning under the administrative control of Directorate General of Health Service, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi.

❖ The Institution is now empowered to award Medical Degrees, Diplomas, etc., under the clauses 23 & 24 of the said Act. Such Degrees / Diploma shall be deemed to be included in the schedules to the respective Acts governing Medical Council of India/National Medical Commission, Indian Nursing Council, and Dental Council of India, entitling the holders to the same privileges as those attached to the equivalent awards from the recognized Universities of India.

❖ JIPMER imparts Undergraduate (UG), Postgraduate (PG) and Super Specialty Medical Training through a hospital with more than 2000 beds. MBBS, BSc, MSc, MPH, MD, MS, MDS, DM, MCh, and PhD are some of the courses offered in several disciplines.

Duration of the courses:

1. BSc Nursing:

BSc Nursing is a full time **4 (Four) years degree course that includes 24 weeks paid internship.**

2. BSc Allied Health Sciences Courses:

- (i) Bachelor of Medical Laboratory Sciences is a full time **4 (four) year course with 3.5 years of theory & practical classes and 6 months of compulsory internship.**
- (ii) All other BSc Allied Health Sciences courses are full time **4 (four) years course with 3 years of theory & practical classes and 1 year of compulsory internship.**

Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD):

Five percent (5%) of the seats are reserved horizontally to PwBD candidates as per 'The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016'.

Note: The number and distribution of seats may vary depending upon the periodic directives /decisions from Competent Authorities.

DEFINITION OF CATEGORIES

1. Unreserved (UR):

A candidate who is an Indian national satisfying the requirement of eligibility as prescribed by the NTA NEET 2024 Information Bulletin is eligible under this category.

2. Other Backward Classes (OBC) (NON-Creamy Layer):

Applicants are required to ensure that he/she does NOT belong to the persons/sections (Creamy Layer) mentioned in Column 3 of the Schedule to the Government of India, Department of Personnel & Training O.M. No. 36012/22/93 -Estt. (SCT) dated 08/09/93 which is modified vide OM No. 36033/3/20 04 Estt. (Res.) dated 09/03/2004 or the latest notification of the Government of India (ie. Central list) in support of his/her claim.

OBC-NCL Certificate must be in the format as mentioned in the Annexure - I and should have been obtained on or after **01.04.2023**.

Note: OBC – creamy layer candidates are **NOT** eligible under this category.

3. Scheduled Caste/Tribe (SC/ST):

Applicants will be required to produce the necessary certificate/s in the format provided. During counseling the certificate as prescribed in M.H.A., O.M., No. 42/21/49-N.G.S. dated the 28.1.1952, as revised in Dept. of Per-& A.R. letter No. 36012/6/76-Est. (S.CT), dated the 29.10.1977, to be produced by candidate belonging to a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe in support of his/her claim.

SC/ST Certificate must be in the format as mentioned in the Annexure - II

4. Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs):

Applicants who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources that is, salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:

- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation,

his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years. (As per the Office Memorandum F.No.36039/1/2019 dt. 31st January 2019 by Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pension & F.No.A11013/01/2019 dt. 28th February 2019 by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India)

INCOME & ASSET Certificate must be in the format as mentioned in the Annexure – III and should have been obtained on or after **01.04.2023**. Candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Central List) categories are not eligible to apply under EWS category.

5. Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD):

Five percent (5%) of the annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, based on the merit list.

The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability. The Percentage of the candidates' disability will be assessed by JIPMER Medical Board and the decision of the JIPMER Medical Board will be final in this regard.

The eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in medicine with specified disability shall be in accordance with Annexure - V (as per the gazette notification by MCI in Amendment Notification No. MCI-34(41)/2018-Med./170045 dated 4th February, 2019)

The disability certificate should be uploaded at the time of online application. (It should be certified by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board of the State or Central Govt. Hospitals/Institutions).

Puducherry UT Domicile

A candidate is considered to be domicile to the Union Territory of Puducherry (P-UR), if he/she satisfies at least one of the following domicile criteria (Refer Annexure – IV for the Format of Certificates)

- a) Those candidates or whose parent (either mother or father or both) or their Guardian (in the case of children who have lost both parents) have been residing continuously in this Union territory for at least five years immediately preceding the closing date of registration i.e. 24.10.2024.
- b) Those who have passed 10th/12th standard or any other public examination and for that purpose had undergone academic studies continuously for 5 successive classes immediately preceding the qualifying examination (including the year of the qualifying examination) in recognized educational institutions(s) located in Puducherry Union Territory and having their residence in the Puducherry Union Territory for five years continuously during that period.
- c) Children whose parents are Central Government Servants, Employees of Central Government Autonomous institutions, State Government Servants, Defence Personnel, Central Paramilitary Forces, Employees of Public Sector Undertakings wholly or substantially run either by the Central Government or by the Puducherry Union Territory administration, posted and serving in the Puducherry Union Territory

for at least a minimum continuous period of three years immediately prior to the last date of submission of application and the children of the above said employees should have studied in the Higher Secondary Course of two years in any of the schools in the U.T. of Puducherry and should have also passed the Higher Secondary Examination from the same school. [G.O. Ms. No. 04, Puducherry, dated 09-02-2016 of the Chief Secretariat, (Hr. & Tech. Edn.) Puducherry]

- d) Children of Defence Personnel who were killed or disabled in action and who have declared Puducherry as their hometown.

6. Puducherry – Unreserved (P-UR):

A candidate satisfying the afore-mentioned definitions of category (1) as well as Puducherry domicile criteria mentioned above is eligible under this category.

7. Puducherry Other Backward Classes – Non-Creamy Layer (P-OBC-NCL):

A candidate satisfying the afore-mentioned definitions of categories (2) as well as Puducherry domicile criteria mentioned above is eligible under this category.

8. Puducherry Scheduled Caste (P-SC):

A candidate satisfying the afore-mentioned definitions of categories (3) as well as Puducherry domicile criteria mentioned above is eligible under this category.

9. Puducherry Scheduled Tribe (P-ST):

A candidate satisfying the afore-mentioned definitions of categories (3) as well as Puducherry domicile criteria mentioned above is eligible under this category.

10. Puducherry Economically Weaker Sections (P-EWSs):

A candidate satisfying the afore-mentioned definition of categories (4) as well as Puducherry domicile criteria mentioned above is eligible under this category.

11. Puducherry Persons with Benchmark Disability (P-PwBD):

A candidate satisfying the mentioned definition of categories Puducherry domicile criteria mentioned above as well as (5) mentioned above.

Any dispute in Residence/Community certificate of Puducherry issued by Authorised Personnel of Govt. of Puducherry should be referred to the Court of law and will not be dealt by this Institution.

Note:

Candidates who submit false information / forged certificates will be subjected to prosecution. If it is confirmed, their candidature will be cancelled.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO BSc COURSES

1. The Applicant should be an Indian National
2. **The applicants should have qualified in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (UG) [NEET (UG) 2024] conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).**
3. He/she should have completed the **age of 17 years (completed the age of 17 years on or before 31st December 2024)**, the year of his/her admission to the 1st year BSc Courses, i.e. they should have been **born on or before 01-01-2008**. (Request for relaxation from the prescribed age limit will not be considered for any category of applicants).

There is no upper age limit.

4. The applicants should have passed the qualifying examinations in the manner mentioned below:
 - a) The Higher / Senior Secondary Examination or the Indian School Certificate Examination which is equivalent to 10+2 Higher / Senior Secondary Examination after a period of 12 years study, the last two years of such study comprising **Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany & Zoology** (which shall include practical tests in these subjects) and with **English** at a level not less than the core course for English as prescribed by the National Council of Educational Research and Training after introduction of the 10+2+3 educational structure as recommended by the National Committee on Education.
 - b) The applicant must have passed in the subjects of **Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany & Zoology and English** individually. Further, Candidates belonging to Unreserved / Economically Weaker Sections categories must have obtained a minimum of **50%** marks taken together in **Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany & Zoology** at the qualifying examination
 - c) Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribe or Other Backward Classes must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the subjects of **Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany & Zoology** taken together in the qualifying examination.
 - d) For PwBD candidates in Unreserved / Economically Weaker Sections categories, the minimum marks in **Physics, Chemistry, Biology/ Botany & Zoology taken** together in the qualifying examination is **45%**.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE APPLICATION

Application for admission to BSc Courses is through online mode only.

Steps of application:

1. Registration
2. Entry of candidate's details & uploading required documents
3. Finalizing the application

Read the prospectus and instructions carefully before starting the application process and be ready with the required documents / photograph / signature.

1. Registration:

- Click the link in the Home page www.jipmer.edu.in and navigate to the link 'JIPMER BSc (Nursing & Allied Health Sciences) Courses Admission-2024-25 Academic Year' and start the registration process.
- FULL NAME entered by the candidate in the application must match with his/ her XII Mark sheet. (Spelling and order must be same)
- **Candidates should give the same email ID and mobile number that were submitted while applying for NEET (UG) 2024.**
- Soft copies of the following documents should be kept ready before starting the online application process.
 - Photograph
 - Signature
 - NEET (UG) 2024 Score card (Re-revised)
 - OBC-NCL, SC, ST, EWS, PwBD and Puducherry UT domicile certificates, whichever is/are applicable

2. Entry of candidate details & Uploading required documents:

Candidate details

The candidates should fill the details carefully. No request for change in the details provided by the candidate in the application will be considered or entertained after submission of the online application.

Photograph

- Softcopy of recent colour passport size photograph with light background is required. Black & White / Polaroid photographs are not acceptable. Name of the file: "Candidate Photograph.jpg" (e.g. Meera Photograph.jpg).
- Photograph MUST have been taken on or after 01.01.2024.

- Specifications of the photograph: Size of file: **Less than 1 Mb in jpeg format.**

Signature

- Candidate must sign on a plain white sheet which should be scanned, cropped and saved as “*Candidate Signature.jpg*” (eg. Meera signature.jpg).
- Specifications of the signature: Size of file: **Between 20 Kb & 100 Kb in jpeg format.**

Uploading Certificates:

- Candidates should upload National Eligibility cum Entrance test (UG) [NEET (UG) 2024] score card (Re-revised).
- Candidates belonging to categories other than UR & P-UR category should upload his/her caste/community certificate/Income & Asset Certificate.
- Candidates belonging to PwBD category should upload his/her PwBD certificate.
- Candidates belonging to EWS category should upload his/her Income & Asset Certificate in the format as mentioned in the Annexure - III

Candidate should scan the NEET (UG) 2024 score card, ID / Address Proof, Caste/Community/ Income & Asset Certificate/PwBD certificate (whichever is applicable) **in PDF format only**. The accepted size limit for each scanned certificate is **less than 300 Kb**.

3. Finalizing the application:

- The process of submission of application online is completed only after clicking the ‘Finalize the application’ button after uploading candidate details, Scanned Photograph, scanned community/PwBD certificates/NEET UG 2024 score card as applicable, and scanned signature.
- The candidates are advised to download a copy of their filled-in application. However, online application form will be sent to candidate’s registered email id once the application is finalized. Candidates should bring printout of the duly signed application on the day of certificate verification/ counselling.
- Candidates need NOT send hard copy of the completed application to the Institute.
- **If the candidate finds an error of entry committed by him/her in the application after the submission, a fresh application should be submitted. The previous application will automatically stand cancelled. No E-Mail or Written communication will be entertained in this regard.**

DISCLAIMER:

1. Mere completion of Registration does NOT confer right to counselling/admission.
2. Incomplete application and application with false/wrong details may lead to rejection of candidature at any stage.

COUNSELING AND ADMISSION

Counseling for admission to BSc courses will be held in person at JIPMER. The details of counseling will be published on JIPMER website at the time of declaration of the eligible candidates list. Candidates are advised to periodically visit JIPMER website www.jipmer.edu.in for updates.

Counseling:

Candidates on the published eligible list reporting at the counseling venue within the stipulated time and whose certificates in original are verified and found to be in order will be allowed to participate in the counseling. No new registrations will be accepted under any circumstances beyond 24.10.2024.

Seats will be allotted to candidates based on their choice, merit, and seat availability.

Admission:

On the same day of seat allotment, the following documents should be submitted, failing which admission will be denied:

- All the certificates in original (as given in the list below)
- Three sets of photocopies of all the certificates
- Six recent Passport size colour photographs

List of certificates to be submitted at the time of admission:

8. Character and Conduct Certificate from the Head of the Institute last studied.
9. Residence Certificate issued by Revenue Authority not below the rank of Tahsildar or Aadhaar card.
10. For candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes-NCL/ Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe: Community Certificate, obtained from the competent authority.
11. For Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) candidates: required Income & Asset Certificate as in Annexure III.
12. Transfer Certificate from the Head of the Institution last studied / Migration Certificate*
13. For candidates applying under Puducherry UT quota, Residence Certificate / Employer Certificate as in the Annexure IV.

14. For PwBD candidates: Medical Certificate from the authorized-centres as listed in the NTA NEET 2024 Information Bulletin.

Note: If the certificates are in a language other than English, an English translation of the certificate attested by a Gazette Officer should be produced.

**To submit Transfer/ Migration Certificate, a maximum of one week time period from the date of issue of provisional admission order will be permitted.*

Fees should be paid online and fees once paid will not be refunded.

Note: Submission of Documents and payment of fees as mentioned above should be done on the same day of allotment of seat.

Warning:

At any time, if the competent authorities find that admission has been offered based on false/ incorrect information/ documents and suppression of relevant facts, educational qualification or quota, the admission offered or the admission already completed shall be cancelled, irrespective of the stage of study of that course. Further, legal proceedings will also be initiated against such candidates for such action/(s). Hence, Candidates are warned against indulging in such action/ (s), in their own interest. All parents are also requested to make note of the above provision, and take due care and diligence, in all matters concerning admission to the courses.

PENALTY FOR LEAVING THE COURSE

(MID – STREAM DEPARTURE)

A candidate can discontinue the course at any time on his/her request for any reason subject to payment of penalty amount as mentioned below. Any fees paid will not be refunded.

Penalty mentioned hereunder has to be paid for relief and return of all original certificates submitted by him/her at the time of admission irrespective of the date of counseling/date of joining.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

- Students may avail a hostel accommodation subject to availability. Hostels are separate for boys and girls.
- Hostel Accommodation is primarily for outstation Candidates.
- Application for accommodation in the hostels will be obtained at the time of admission. An assurance by the parent or guardian for the good conduct and behavior of the candidate during his/her stay in the hostel will be obtained. Rooms will be on first-come-first-serve basis by the Warden with the approval of the Dean (Academic).
- Hostel charges are detailed in Annexure-VII
- Students should read the Hostel manual thoroughly before applying for hostel accommodation.

- Filled-in application forms for hostel accommodation will be collected at the time of admission. Parent or guardian should sign the form with assurance for good conduct and behaviour of the candidate during his/her stay in the hostel. Rooms will be allotted on first-come-first-serve basis by the hostel Wardens with the approval of the Dean (Academic).

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Students shall conform to a high standard of discipline and shall conduct himself/herself, within and outside the precincts of the Institute, in a manner befitting the students of an Institution of National Importance. He/she shall have the seriousness of purpose and shall in every way, train himself to a life of earnest endeavor and co-operation. He/she shall follow strict ethical standards. He/she shall show due courtesy and consideration to the employees of the Institute and Hostels, to his/her fellow scholars/students, respect the wardens of the hostel and the guides/teachers of the Institute and pay due attention and courtesy to visitors and patients in the attached hospital divisions (JIPMER Hostel Rules and Regulations).

HONOUR CODE:

To promote ethical behavior, JIPMER requires every student to agree to abide by the Honour Code. At the time of admission, every student must sign the Honour Code. Violations of this code are taken very seriously and may result in suspension or expulsion. The admission will be withheld if Honour Code applicable to Institute and Hospital related activities is not duly signed and submitted at the time of admission with a copy to the respective department.

RAGGING:

Ragging is banned in this Institute. If a student is found to have indulged in ragging in the past, or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, then he/she may be expelled from the Institute. UGC compliance number for the year 2024 is 21906.

Supreme Court Rules Regarding Ragging:

As per direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus and all the JIPMER authorities are determined not to allow any form of ragging. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or instigates ragging within or outside JIPMER shall have an FIR lodged against him/her by the institution and he/she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/ she shall be expelled from the institution. The punishment may also include suspension from attending the classes, withholding/ withdrawing fellowship/ scholarship and other financial benefits or withholding the **Professional Examination results**.

NOTE:

1. Any attempt on the part of the candidate to influence directly or indirectly the counseling / admission procedures will be viewed seriously and lead to disqualification of the application.

2. JIPMER makes every effort to communicate in time to the candidates regarding the counseling and admission process through its website. JIPMER shall not be held responsible if a candidate does not notice information updated on the website.
