Systemic complications such as myocarditis and encephalitis have also occurred rarely. It is of great importance for faculty and residents of different departments to be aware of such atypical and varied features. Monkeypox is a **Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC)** as declared by **WHO**.
